## The Beginning the Stamp Era

- 1840 Great Britain issues first stamp
- Revolutionizes mail - prepaid letters instead of trying to collect payment from recipient
- The issuance of stamps by government postal authorities spreads around the world

1847 - USA issues first stamp - but what about the rate to send a domestic letter?

$1847-5$ cents prepaid for less then 300 miles, per $1 / 2$ ounce

$1851-3$ cents prepaid for up to 3,000 miles, per $1 / 2$ ounce (effectively anywhere in the USA)

## International Mail in the Early Stamp Era

- As the use of stamps spread the issue of how much to charge for delivery between nations became a challenge
- Initially, governments negotiated bilateral treaties between postal administrations, leading to a profusion of rates


NOTES

- Cover sent from Sheffield, Illinois to Waiblingen, Wurttemburg in 1872
- Tied by fancy dashed $X$ cancel
- Stamp is Scott No. 149, issued March 1871

7 cents from USA to Wurttemburg
Rate went into effect October 1871

## Montgomery Blair 1813-1883



Montgomery Blair, U.S. Postmaster General 1861-64

- Montgomery Blair served as Postmaster General during the first Lincoln Administration, 1861-1864
- Blair implemented numerous innovations including free city delivery, railway mail service, and the creation of the money order system
- To improve international mail delivery, Blair proposed a conference for nations to work on a uniform rate schema
- The conference was held in Paris in 1863, it led to the creation of the Universal Postal Union in 1874


## NOTES

- Aerogramme (Air Letter) is a self folding enveloping with the sender's message written inside, sent at discounted rate from first class Airmail Letter
- 39 cent Blair Aerogramme, Scott UC62, issued November 20, 1989
- 39 cent rate in effect April 3, 1988 until February 3, 1991
- Sent in 1990-2533 in Thai calendar (add 543 to date)


## Universal Postal Union (UPU)

- 1874-22 nations met in Berne, Switzerland to form a general postal union which created a single postal territory for the reciprocal exchange of correspondence between post offices.
- Rates applied to letters, postal cards, books, newspapers, and other printed papers, patterns of merchandise, and legal documents and commercial documents.
- Rates went into affect for participating nations on July 1, 1875.


## NOTES

- Souvenir cards issued as souvenirs at philatelic and numismatic events by the USPS or BEP
- This card is trilingual - German for the nation hosting the event and English and French for the working languages of the UPU
- Heinrich von Stephen, 1831-1897, Postmaster General of the German Empire, organized 1874 Berne UPU conference


## UPU Rates Began July 1, 1875



- 5 cent UPU rate from New York City to London in care of B.F. Stevens dispatch agent for sailor in USS Gettysburg; sent February 23, 1878
- 5 cent stamp is Scott 179


## NOTES

- Benjamin Franklin Stevens, 1833-1902, born in Vermont, moved London in the 1840s
- Served as Dispatch Agent in London which meant he was in charge of mail for US naval vessels serving in the Atlantic and European stations
- The ship that become the USS Gettysburg was built in Scotland and purchased by the Confederacy as blockade runner in 1862, captured by the Union navy in 1863, it stayed in service until 1879 doing survey work in the Mediterranean 1876-1879.
- The recipient, George Partridge Colvocoresses, 1847-1932, went on to serve at the Battle of Manila Bay during the SpanishAmerican War in 1898 and then served as the Commandant of Cadets at the US Naval Academy, 1905-1907


## 5 Cent UPU Surface Rate



## NOTES

- The 5 cent UPU surface rate holds the record for longest continuous use of any US postal rate July 1, 1875 until November 1, 1953, when the rate was increased to 8 cents
- Surface rate used to denote mail not sent by airmail
- This letter was sent/postmarked from a Railway Post Office (RPO)
- 5 cent UPU surface rate to Netherlands, sent September 9, 1953
- Stamp is Scott No. 1021 Centennial of Opening of Japan


## Postal Union of the Americas and Spain (PUAS)



## NOTES

- Regional postal unions are organizations for counties that cooperate on mail service. Currently there at 18 in existence
- The Postal Union of the Americas and Spain (PUAS) was created in 1920
- Mail could be sent between member nations at domestic letter rates
- The PUAS domestic letter rate ended on November 1, 1953; rates reverted to the UPU surface rate.
- 3 cent PUAS rate to Argentina
- Sent October 2, 1946
- 3 cents was the prevailing first-class rate


## PUAS Conference - Bogota, Colombia



## NOTES

- A PUAS Conference was has in Bogota, Colombia October 12 - November 9, 1955
- A series of nine commemorative stamps with issued
- The stamps depicted indigenous leaders, Ferdinand and Isabella, explorers, and "Las Libertadoras" (the Liberators)

## Rating a Cover

## Rating a Cover:

- Look at the date in the cancellation
- Check for any transit or arrival marking (front and back of envelope)
- Check for any auxiliary markings (registered, special delivery etc.)
- With the above information, check a rate table

## Postal Tax

- Postal tax is a surcharge added to mail in addition to the existing postal rate
- $1 / 4$ centavo is postal tax for postcards beginning in 1939
- A flat rate applied to all postcards to cover constructions costs for new Ministry of Posts and Telegraphs in Bogota
